•	Paul felt the need to receive a report from the newborn church in Thessalonica, so he sent back to serve and minister to the new believers there. Paul wanted to check on the state of the Thessalonians' faith, for fear that false teachers might have infiltrated								
•	soon returned with a good report, prompting Paul to pen 1 Thessalonians as a letter of to the new believers.								
•	In, recorded that Paul preached for three Sabbath days to the Jews in the local synagogue (<u>Acts 17:2</u>).								
•	Most scholars believe Paul spent about three, rather than three, with the Thessalonians because he would have had to have been there long enough to receive more than one offering from the Philippian church (Philippians 4:15–16).								
•	Paul's ministry in Thessalonica obviously touched not only Jews but as well. Many Gentiles in the church had come out of, which was not a particular problem among the Jews of that time (<u>1 Thessalonians 1:9</u>).
